Maindee Festival Trader Terms & Conditions

2024

Pitch Location

We want you to have a good trading day and try to make sure that you have an excellent location for the type of goods you are selling. On arrival, you will be shown your pitch area. Large traders can contact us to visit the site in advance. If space is tight, we give preference to traders who book early.

A pitch is a 3x3 metre plot.

Litter Bond

No trade waste is to be left on site. Food traders must pay an additional £50 litter bond, which will be returned at the end of the trading period if 1) Only Bio-degradable disposable packaging is to be used 2) the area of 5 metres in front of your pitch is routinely cleared of litter during the event 3) No waste trade is left on pitch site after the event.

Traders must only sell goods specified in their application. Pitches are priced based on the products stated on the Trader Application Form and fines may occur if the organisation has been misled on the Application Form.

Traders must have finished their set-up and be ready to trade by 12:00 pm on the event day. Traders can enter the site from 11:00 am

Sound system installations are not permitted. Music will be provided at the event.

Bottled Gas

All gas equipment in catering units must have current safety certification. Safety precautions regarding the storage of bottled gas must be followed.

Electrical Supply, Generators and Electrical items

All electrical kits you bring onto the site must meet current safety standards. Silenced diesel generators are allowed on site. We can supply electricity for a charge. Please contact Festival@maindee.com if you need power.

Items not permitted on stalls: Petrol generators, Plastic or Foam disposable food containers - bottles - cups or cutlery, Helium, Black Henna, Glass (except small glass ornaments & jewellery, etc), Body Piercing Equipment, Lasers, Fireworks, Knives & all types of harmful items or illegal goods.

Waste Water

Waste water must be put into containers and disposed of in drains and not poured on the ground. The digging of sumps is prohibited. The environment health officer will check to see how traders dispose of wastewater/liquid.

Partnership act

In regards to other traders, we ask that you keep in mind them throughout the Festival day. Please be kind & considerate of those around you and their goods on the day. All vehicles brought on-site are at the risk of their owners and must be suitably insured. The Festival cannot accept any responsibility for any loss or damages that may occur during the festival or set-up and take-down period or as a result of the actions of other pitch holders.

All tea, coffee and drinking chocolate sold at Maindee Festival must be Fairtrade.

Equipment Charge

Please note that if you require to use one or more of our tables, we have a £5 equipment charge to help the organisation with costs.

Employers' Liability and Public Liability Insurance

Employers' liability and Public Liability Insurance must always be displayed on stalls. Likewise, traders are responsible for ensuring contractors delivering to, or working on their stalls, are suitably insured.

No rebates will be given to traders as a result of adverse weather conditions or as a result of changes in performance programmes within the Festival. The Festival will not accept responsibility for the level of trading during the event.

Terms of Premises licence

Traders are required to comply with the terms of the premises licence. A copy of the Festival licence will be held at the Main Festival Office. If the trader is closed down and/or evicted from the site for contravening the licence or any of these terms and conditions or environmental health standards, they shall not be entitled to any rebate of fees.
